MIA BROOKES WINS YOUNG SPORTSWOMAN OF THE YEAR!

Mia Brookes has deservedly won The Times Young Sportswoman of The Year Award 2023.

Mia burst on to the scene in dramatic style, winning Slopestyle World Championships in Bakuriani, Georgia earlier this year as a 16 Year Old at her first attempt! Mia showed her incredible winning mentality when already guaranteed a silver medal, she decided to throw in the first-ever CAB 1440 double grab in a Women's FIS competition to take the Gold medal and assert herself as the new benchmark for Freestyle Snowboarding whilst also youngest being the ever Snowboard World Champion and the first British person to win a Snowboard Slopestyle World Championships!

Having grown up Snowboarding from a very young age around

Europe, Mia was a regular at the Chill Factore and was picked up by the GBS Freestyle coaches as a 10 year old whilst in Laax.

Mia has also won the gold medal at the 2022 Junior Big Air Championships, whilst picking up the silver medal in the Slopestyle at the same Championships.

Mia's Grandfather and Father were instrumental in designing our freestyle slope. Mia had her first slides at Kidsgrove. She recently dropped in to see us, kindly donating a signed snow board, which is now hung on the wall in the club house. Mia spent some time having photos and signing autographs.

Skiing Abroad- What you need to know.

From January 1st 2023, Italy's new laws for those taking part in Winter Sports came into effect. These include making third party liability insurance compulsory for everyone to have, anyone under the age of 18 must wear a helmet on the slopes, and it is illegal to ski/snowboard under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Third Party Liability Insurance

Italy have brought in new rules that state anyone participating in Winter Sports in the county must have third party liability insurance in case you cause injury or damage to another person or their property. Everyone must carry a copy of this with them. If you cannot produce this if asked you may have your ski pass confiscated. Furthermore, if you do happen to be involved in an incident, authorities will check whether you have cover and there are hefty fines in place if you do not.

Whilst most good quality Travel Insurance policies will include third party liability insurance as standard, this is not always the case. It is therefore vitally important that, before you leave for your holiday, you check your Travel Insurance policy to see if you have third party liability insurance.

Equally, it is important that you have appropriate Winter Sports Insurance on your travel policy. In most cases, a standard Travel Insurance policy will not provide cover specifically related to Winter Sports which can be problematic if you happen to require cover whilst you are skiing or snowboarding. Specific Winter Sports cover should be taken out before you travel to ensure you have cover should the unexpected happen on your travels.

U18's Must Wear Helmets

Previously, the law stated that any child under the age of 14 must wear a helmet whilst on the slopes, however, this has now been extended to anyone under the age of 18. This is not just for skiers and snowboarders but for any 'Winter Sports Enthusiasts'. 'Winter Sports Enthusiasts' includes skiers, freestyle skiers, telemark skiers, snowboarders, and tobogganers.

Head injuries are unsurprisingly quite common on the slopes and as such the law amendments have been brought in to further protect minors.

Skiing under the influence of drugs or alcohol is now prohibited.

Whilst many like to enjoy Après Ski on their holidays, this will have to be reserved for the bottom of the mountains and not halfway up. Italy now has a zero-tolerance approach to those skiing under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Whilst there isn't a specific, numerical limit, it is assumed that it will mirror that of the driving blood alcohol limit which is 0.5mg per litre of blood. Please note that this limit may be different than any specific blood alcohol limit on your Travel Insurance policy.

Remember to always check your own insurance policy& resort website before you travel for the most up to date information.

Advice on skiing abroad:

- * Always carry your up to date GHIC card. If you do need medical help, your Insurance Company may not pay for any treatment that is covered under this scheme.
- * Wherever you are going on holiday you should carry details of your travel insurance policy together with a form of identification.
- * Smartphones are wonderful, but battery life can be shortened by the cold. A hard copy of the resort map & **Printed copies of** your documents are essential, together with details of where you are staying, and contact numbers for someone you are skiing with may be useful to have in your jacket pocket.
- * Be stylish and wear a helmet.
- *Check the requirements of the country you ae travelling to well in advance.
- * Don't forget your suncream!
