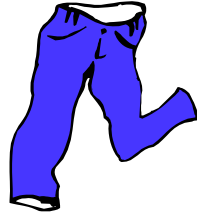

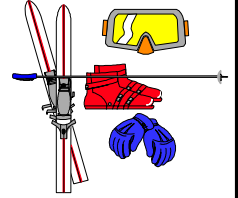

MASTERCLASS IS BACK!

- Are you looking to improve your ski technique?
- Have you hit a plateau and wondering how to take your skiing to the next level?
- Are you looking to get your ski legs back for your next skiing holiday?
- Are you thinking about becoming an instructor?
- Are you looking for a fresh challenge?

If the answer to any of the questions above is yes then maybe Masterclass is for you!

Masterclass is for intermediate to advanced skiers who are looking to take that next step towards improving their skiing ability. The class works on improving the foundations of your skiing technique (balance, stance, body management etc.) and in turn looks to improve your personal performance. The classes are run by our 2 coaches Neil Ravenscroft and Marc Clowes and are held every other Sunday evening between 5pm and 7:30pm. The dates for the rest of this year are below:

Junior Development Club

As we are always getting new members joining the club, I thought it a good idea to refresh present members and inform new alike, of what Kids Club is all about.

Kids Club is probably a bad name for what we are trying to achieve on a Sunday morning. It was set up many moons ago with the sole aim of providing our younger members with free coaching without the added distraction of older members and parents being on the slope at the same time.



A better name would probably be Junior Development Club.

I have seen children progress from pure beginners to racing in external squads. Some even compete in competitions all over the country and train on snow over the winter months. My eldest son was one of these juniors and was the main reason I took on the challenge of running the Junior Development Club some 6 years ago.

My ultimate goal is to see all the juniors try and get to this level at some point in their skiing career, or to reach the best of their potential.

It can get quite busy on a Sunday morning and for me to be able to help as many juniors as possible its imperative that we work as a team. Sometimes they may think that the exercises and tasks are boring, but they are important to enable them to progress to the best of their ability. I do try to make it fun as much as possible, but the best things in life don't always come easy. I want all the kids to get to a level where they can ski better than their parents, trust me this does happen on many occasions!!

To be able to get the best out of this time its important for the kids to know that Sunday morning isn't recreational skiing. Someone coming along who doesn't want to be involved can cause disruption to the group and make the task a lot harder than it needs to be. No one is forced to join in but if they don't want to get involved there are plenty of other times for pure recreational skiing for them, Saturday or Sunday afternoon being perfect examples of this.

If any one wants to have a chat then you will always find me at the top of the slope on a Sunday morning.
