

### **Slope Development Update.**

Have you seen it? The ground has been cleared of tree trunks and undergrowth. Work has commenced on re-sculpturing the ground levels, inserting the drainage system, re-siting the old permanent fencing and adding new permanent fencing where needed. By the end of September the area should be permanently fenced, drains installed and the basic contours completed. That will be the completion of Phase 1. Phase 2 will not commence until next spring.

### Your ideas are needed.

When you have had a good look at the new space you may have some good ideas as to what features you would like to see



included. We need a slope that is functional, challenging and fun with safety in mind.

Please add your suggestions to the sheet on the notice board. In the autumn we will hold an open meeting where we will have on display a proposed design for the new slope with your ideas incorporated where possible. Look out for the date of the open meeting to be posted on the notice board.

### Can you help?



During the Autumn and winter a comprehensive landscaping scheme will be undertaken along the perimeter fencing which will provide a green

interface to disguise the palling fence from the slope side. A Hawthorn hedge is also to be established on the park side of the fence. That means almost 1,000 shrubs and trees have to be planted. To save costs we will set up a working party from our membership to do the planting over several weekends. If you would like to help please put your name on a list on the notice board and we will notify you when the dates have been arranged.

The work has continued preparing information for the requests for additional funding. BIFFA have invited the club to apply for a grant. Talks are continuing with Newcastle Under Lyme Borough Council, Snowsport England, County Sports Partnership and the club on the preparation of a bid for funding from Sport England.

As was mentioned in previous newsletter's something which will act in our favour when applying for extra funding is if we can show that the club members are supporting the project by giving a donation specifically towards the project fund.

So, can you help your club by donating a small or large amount to go directly into the project fund? If you feel you would like to donate please give it to someone behind the ski counter. If all our adult members donated £10 we would raise £5,000. If you are a tax payer then it can be gift aided to mean more. Remember the club is run entirely by volunteers which is why it is the cheapest skiing in the country. We need your support to improve your skiing experience at Kidsgrove!

### **Directors Report - September 2013**

Another year has passed and I'm glad to say that the club continues to thrive. Once again there has been a steady intake of new members to replace those who have left the club so that the membership remains around 900.

Our treasurers have once again managed our finances by tightly controlling expenditure resulting in a sum of money being available for future development.

Open day was very successful with almost all the sessions full resulting in many booking beginners' lessons.

In January, after a great deal of negotiation with Newcastle Under Lyme Borough Council, the club was finally given approval to develop the land to the side of the current slope. The decision was made to clear the land before the birds had time to nest. Fortunately the very cold winter resulted in delayed nesting and we were given an extension date by Staffordshire Wildlife to the end of March. Bat ecologists were also consulted to make sure bat welfare was safeguarded. The area has been cleared and re profiled ready for the next stage which it is hoped will commence next spring. The council has agreed to grant a variation of the current lease held by the club to include the extra land and the lease will be extended to run for thirty years from the date of the new lease. Decisions still have to be made regarding the way the extra land will be utilised to provide a varied ski terrain.

This year's club holiday to Les Menuires in January was enjoyed by all. Next year's club holiday to Sestriere has proved popular, there are approximately 60 places booked.

More instructors have become qualified this year and development of both qualified and unqualified instructors has continued on Friday nights. One of our Level 3 Coaches has gained his Level 4 Coach Award and four of our level 1 instructors have gained their Level 2 awards. We have several newly qualified Level 1 instructors. The Master Classes which have been held on Sunday evenings led by our coaches continue to be very popular.

The club continues to work within the Snowmark accreditation criteria demonstrating that it meets Snowsport England's criteria as to playing programme, safeguarding and protecting children, knowing the club and its community and club management. Snowmark is an acknowledgement that we take these issues seriously and that we provide a high quality and welcoming environment for participants in the sport.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the people who have helped to run the club over the last year. Thanks must go to those who run and maintain the kitchen so that it continues to meet the Level 5 Food Hygiene rating awarded by Newcastle Borough Council. We are lucky to have so many people willing to give so much time and energy to the club.

Finally, this club is run by the members for the benefit of the members, the skiing is only so cheap because nobody is paid a penny. The club needs a little effort from a lot of people to help it run smoothly. Out of the 550 or so adult members only around 60 presently give some of their time. If you can spare a few hours to help, please see one of the committee members or our Volunteer Coordinator, Norman Salmon and volunteer. Your services will be most welcome.
